## What we've been doing



At Long Last! The Covid Memorial Bench (ordered in 2021) arrived, at the end of August. The suppliers had an enormous number of orders and delays with materials.

It is now in the Duke Street Garden with the cherry tree planted by Burnley Council in memory of people who died during the Coronavirus pandemic and beside the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee bench

The World Health Organisation (WHO) declared the outbreak as a public health emergency of international concern on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2020 and as a pandemic on 11<sup>th</sup> March 2020. As of October 2022, the pandemic had caused more than 622 million cases and 6.5 million deaths making it one of the deadliest in history.



#### Queen Elizabeth II 1926 - 2022

We were deeply saddened by the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on 8th September. We all mourned the profound loss of a great monarch who served our country faithfully for all her life and who was loved the world over. She was an inspirational woman who will be remembered and celebrated for a long time.

The Union Flag on Duke St was lowered to half mast. The Briercliffe with Extwistle Parish Council Book of Condolence was put in the Community Centre and almost a hundred messages of sympathy and remembrance were shared and written in the book. Parish Councillors and volunteers staffed the Centre at various times for over 2 weeks.

## Rats! Bird Feeding and Rubbish

There is no denying that if you feed birds in Rose celebrated your garden you run the risk of attracting rats her 100 year too. We have lots of reports of rats around the Birthday on Parish.

Rats are clever but they are also lazy. They will take whatever is on offer that takes the least effort



and so food on the floor will be what attracts them at first. Some Bird Feeder tips... **Reducing spillage is essential** Using a bird feeder with a spillage tray will prevent small seeds from dropping out. When filling your bird feeders, fill them over a bin to avoid spillage onto the floor. Birds do not have many taste buds and so adding hot pepper such as cayenne or hot chilli flakes to bird food can deter rats. Store bird seed in a plastic box. This will ensure rats don't smell the seed.



Make it hard for rats to access feeders! Ensure the feeder is high enough so rats can't jump up to it. Some feeders come with a pole which are too high for rats to reach. Ensure the feeder is placed away from branches or anywhere else a rat can jump from.

**Rubbish** - Rats are easily attracted by overflowing bins & easily accessible food waste. They can squeeze through small holes and easily nibble their way through bin bags. Good hygiene will minimise the impact of an infestation. Small changes such as regularly emptying bins, cleaning routines and blocking off any holes, & ensuring all rubbish is disposed of properly.
